General Concerns

- State of the world's oceans and seas is deteriorating
- No system of assessments that gives a global picture of the state of the marine environment or of socio-economic aspects
- Approach to understanding the oceans needs to be integrated and not sectoral
- Oceans issues are interlinked including with social and economic development on land
- Need for a more effective interface between scientific knowledge and decision-making
