## SUMMARY POINTS FROM SOCIO ECONOMIC TABLE

#### Main points from the Table

- Most of the chapters assigned to the socio economic aspects of the report were deemed to be <u>deficient in well known socio economic</u> <u>assessments</u>
- Much of the information cited seemed to be in grey literature
- There seem to be <u>few regional assessments</u> many are national or sub-national

## Overall Capacity Needs and how to address them

- Both <u>human and institutional capacity are weak in the Region</u>.
   In that context we suggest that in seeking to strengthen the human and institutional capacity there is usually a trade-off and therefore we need to have informed decision making in that prioritisation process.
- <u>Networks national and regional</u> offer solutions to build capacity. Another way to strengthen capacity is to network regional projects and programmes.
- <u>Lack of political capacity</u> e.g. translating interdisciplinary research into policy. Need to improve the link between societally driven research, evidence from science and other sources, into producing actions that improve well being.

## Overall Capacity Needs and how to address them

- The social sciences could help articulate research questions based on what the political priorities may be (which could help close the gap between the policy making and implementation).
- Careful attention needs to be paid to <u>communication strategies</u> that are <u>appropriate to</u> <u>the knowledge demands</u> of varying publics which range from the political to civil society organisations and communities.

# BIG MESSAGES (WOA AND SOCIO ECONOMIC MESSAGES)

### Big Messages (1)

- What might be an appropriate node for sharing information on the Caribbean in the context of the WOA?
  - Cartagena Convention/CEP ?
- A socio economic assessments are often site specific therefore there is need to build a regional picture based on scaling up (where possible).

### Big Messages (2)

- What is the strategy going forward with respect to communication, information dissemination etc.?
- There should be an opportunity for public engagement as early in the process as feasible with connections to the political processes so that the output answers specific societal questions
- Need to do upstream demand-driven (country driven) analyses to ensure there is ownership/buy-in of outputs and follow-up (the Sustainability dimension)

### Big Messages (3)

- What is the value added to be derived from the WOA process vs other meta assessments and processes past and present (and future)
- From a socio economic perspective there needs to be a sense of the Total Econ Value e.g. the cost of degradation from pollution but also capturing use and non-use values from the ocean.

### Big Messages (4)

- The WOA should capture cross cutting issues:
  - Climate change issues (ocean acidification, SST, flooding etc.)
  - Gender
  - Poor and Vulnerable Communities
  - Governance specifically as an integrating factor across the 30-odd chapters.
